MILK PRODUCTS

MILK PRODUCTS TRADE

THIS REPORT on the Milk Products Trade relates to establishments engaged wholly or mainly in the manufacture of butter, cheese, condensed milk, evaporated milk, dried milk, etc., including infants' and invalids' foods with a milk base, and in sterilising (pasteurising), cooling and bottling milk. Milk bottling by retailers who do not maintain a central bottling or pasteurising depot is excluded.

The gross output shown in Table 1 for 1937 and 1935 excludes the output of establishments wholly or mainly engaged in the processing and distribution of whole milk.

For the year 1950, Census of Production returns were required, in Great Britain, only from establishments that sold no merchanted goods nor undertook retailing during the year; other establishments (i.e., those which engaged in merchanting or retailing as well as production) made returns in the Census of Distribution only. Information for 1950 comparable to that for any other year in this trade is, therefore, not available.

This trade corresponds to minimum list heading 154 (1) in the Standard Industrial Classification.
