# THE WOODEN CRATES, CASES, BOXES AND TRUNKS TRADE

### INTRODUCTORY

This trade comprises firms that were engaged wholly or mainly in the manufacture of wooden crates, cases, boxes and trunks.

The figures shown in the following tables (except Table V) relate to Great Britain only, particulars of the small production in Northern Ireland being included in the report on the Timber Trade (see page 106).

In the absence of quantitative particulars of output, Table VI is amitted.
