## 124 Footwear

This Report on the Footwear Industry relates to establishments engaged wholly or mainly in manufacturing footwear of all types and materials. The cutting of leather soles and heels is included but not wooden soles, heels or lasts, nor plastics components.

This industry corresponds to minimum list heading 450 in the Standard Industrial Classification (Revised 1968) which has been used for the first time as a hasis of classification in the 1968 Census.

The industry corresponds to the Footwear Industry(Part 101) in the Reports on the last detailed Census of Production for 1963 , except that sports boots and shoes with uppers other than wholly or mainly of leather, rubber protective footwear, and moulded rubber bottoms (soles and heels) formerly included in the Rubber Industry (Part 119) are now included in this industry.

Throughout this Report, the figures given for 1963 have been reclassified, as far as possible, according to the Standard Industrial Classification (Revised 1968) so that data for 1963 and 1968 are on the same industrial basis. However the reclassification of small firms, which provided limited information only, has been arbitrary.

In interpreting the data in the tables it is essential to bear in mind the notes and definitions which appear on pages (i) to (iv).
