## Soft furnishings trade

THIS REPORT on the Soft Furnishings Trade relates to establishments engaged wholly or mainly in the manufacture of curtains, blinds, loose covers, quilts, cushions, feather beds, pillows, mattresses (other than wire mattresses), divan beds and similar goods. Rubber mattresses, pillows and cushions are excluded, they are included in the report on the Rubber Trade (Volume 11, Trade A).

This trade corresponds to minimum list heading $171(1)$ in the Standard Industrial Classification.

Establishments in this trade were not separately classified in Northern Ireland in 1950, 1949, and 1935, and particulars of the small production for those years are included in the report on the Furniture and Upholstery Trade (Volume 10. Trade B)
