THE CATTLE, DOG AND POULTRY FOODS TRADE

Note.—For information regarding the scope of the Census, instructions given to firms for making returns, and definitions of the terms used in this report, reference should be made to the Introductory Notes on pages v to xviii.

Introductory

This trade comprises firms that were engaged wholly or mainly in the manufacture of cattle, dog and poultry foods, except grain milling products (page 34), oil-cake made by seed crushers (page 351) and certain feeding-stuffs occurring as by-products of other trades. The following table shows the main results of the Censuses of 1930 and 1924 in respect of firms in Great Britain that employed an average of more than ten persons:—

Deficiencies in 1930 aggregates.—The aggregate number of persons employed in 1930 by firms that stated that they employed not more than ten persons on the average was 459, the corresponding figure for 1924 being 330. The value of the gross output of the small firms in 1924 was £356,000, and particulars of the items included in this figure and in the output of £112,000 for Northern Ireland, particulars of which cannot be stated separately, are given below:—
