ELECTRIC LIGHTING ACCESSORIES AND FITTINGS TRADE

THIS REPORT on the Electric Lighting Accessories and Fittings Trade relates to establishments engaged wholly or mainly in the manufacture of electric lighting accessories and fittings and electric bell apparatus. This trade is included with the manufacture of domestic electrical appliances and other electrical goods in minimum list heading 79 (2) in the Standard Industrial Classification.

Any establishments in Northern Ireland are excluded in 1948; no production was recorded there in this trade for 1946, 1937 or 1935.
