This Report on the Fertilisers Industry relates to establishments engaged wholly or mainly in manufacturing or compounding artificial fertilisers.

This industry corresponds to minimum list heading 278 in the Standard Industrial Classification (Revised 1968) which has been used for the first time as a basis of classification in the 1968 Census.

The industry was included in the Fertilisers and Chemicals for Pest Control Industry (Part 26) in the Reports on the last detailed Census of Production for 1963, except that ammonium nitrate (other than mixed with lime or chalk) and ammonium phosphates were shown in the Report on General Chemicals (Part 27). The manufacture of chemicals for pest control which were shown as sub-divisions of the industry in the 1963 Report are now the subject of a separate Report for 1968.

Throughout this Report, the figures given for 1963 have been reclassified as far as possible, according to the Standard Industrial Classification (Revised 1968) so that data for 1963 and 1968 are on the same industrial basis. However the reclassification of small firms, which provided limited information only, has been arbitrary. Comparability of figures between 1963 and 1968 is further affected in this industry, and elsewhere in the Chemical Order, by differences in the reporting units of large firms engaged in distinct processes of chemical and chemical products manufacture.

In interpreting the data in the tables it is essential to bear in mind the notes and definitions which appear on pages (i) to (iv).
