This Report on the Insulated Wires and Cables Industry relates to establishments engaged wholly or mainly in manufacturing insulated electrical instrument wire, winding wire, cables for telecommunication and for power transmission, and cable jointing materials and accessories (other than insulating materials).

This industry corresponds to minimum list heading 362 in the Standard Industrial Classification (Revised 1968) which has been used for the first time as a basis of classification in the 1968 Census. The definition of this industry however is unchanged from the last detailed Census of Production for 1963 in which it was reported (Part 56).

In interpreting the data in the tables it is essential to bear in mind the notes and definitions which appear on pages (i) to (iv).
