This Report on the Cutlery, Spoons, Forks and Plated Tableware, etc, Industry relates to establishments engaged wholly or mainly in manufacturing spoons and forks, table knives, pocket and sheath knives, pruning knives, razors (not metals (other than of gold or platinum) or plated with precious metals (eg silver plated on nickel silver), and electroplated and stainless steel tableware are
included but surgical cutlery is excluded.

This industry corresponds to minimum list heading 392 in the Standard Industrial
Classification (Revised 1968) which has been used for the first time as a basis of classification in the 1968 Census.
The industry corresponds to the Cutlery Industry (Part 69) in the Reports on the last detailed Census of Production for 1963, except that tableware of metals other than gold or platinum, finished spoons and forks and blanks therefor a
knives, complete with blades, plated with precious metals, were shown in the Report on the Jewellery, Plate and Refining of Precious Metals Industry (Part 73)
Throughout this Report, the figures given for 1963 have been reclassified, as far as possible, according to the Standard Industrial Classification (Revised 1968) so that data for 1963 and 1968 are on the same industrial basis. However has been arbitrary.
