TEXTILE FINISHING TRADE
THIS REPORT on the Textile Finishing Trade relates to establishments engaged wholly or mainly in the bleaching, dyeing, printing and finishing of textile yarns and fabrics other than lace.

This trade corresponds to minimum list heading 123 (1), (2) and (5) in the Standard Industrial Classification.

Establishments in this trade in Northern Ireland (which are excluded in 1948) accounted in 1935 for about 5 per cent. of the net output for the
