74 Radio and electronic components

This Report on the Radio and Electronic Components Industry relates to establishments engaged wholly or mainly in manufacturing electronic valves (including cathode ray tubes, but excluding glass envelopes), semi-conductors and electronic rectifiers; integrated circuits, including thin and thick film passive and hybrid circuits, monolithic semi-conductor circuits; and radio and electronic components and assemblies including resistors, capacitors, inductors, circuit breakers for electronic equipment, sound reproduction components, printed circuits and other components and assemblies not elsewhere specified. Electronic components for broadcast receiving and sound reproducing equipment are included.

This industry corresponds to minimum list heading 364 in the Standard Industrial Classification (Revised 1968) which has been used for the first time as a basis of classification in the 1968 Census, except that tape decks (other than those for use with computers and related equipment) are excluded.

The industry formed part of the Radio and Other Electronic Apparatus Industry (Part 58) in the last detailed Census of Production for 1963.

Throughout this Report, the figures given for 1963 have been reclassified, as far as possible, according to the Standard Industrial Classification (Revised 1968) so that data for 1963 and 1968 are on the same industrial basis. However the reclassification of small firms, which provided limited information only, has been arbitrary.

In interpreting the data in the tables it is essential to bear in mind the notes and definitions which appear on pages (i) to (iv).
