SPECIAL NOTE FOR PURCHASERS

Reports on the Census of Production for separate industries are being published in the Business Monitor series. These Monitors have a code P (for production) followed by A (indicating an annual series) and then by a number indicating the industry covered by the report.

Commencing with the 1980 census, the first Annual Census of Production to be conducted on the Standard Industrial Classification (Revised 1980), separate reports will in general appear for each 3 digit Group of the new classification. Results for 1980 include 1979 back data but more detailed 1979 figures based on the new classification have been published as a single separate Business Monitor (PA1002.1). This includes the results of the 1979 Purchases Inquiry. Reports on the Census of Production for the years prior to 1980 are available at the Minimum List Heading, or sub division of a Minimum List Heading, of the Standard Industrial Classification (Revised 1968).

PA130 EXTRACTION OF MINERAL OIL AND NATURAL GAS

Exploration for and extraction of petroleum on land and offshore; "petroleum" in this context includes mineral oil, methane, ethane, propane, butane and condensates. The heading includes the activities of holders of petroleum exploration and production licences. Also included are the activities of licensees' contractors and agents providing services unique to this industry and not allocable to any other heading in the classification, e.g. well drilling, seismic surveying specifically for petroleum deposits and offshore pipelaying. (The provision of other services, e.g. manufacturing, repairing, catering, transport, procurement or hiring should be included in the approriate headings elsewhere in the classification). Mining and retorting of oil shale are included under this heading. Also included is the operation of land terminals for stabilisation, separation and storage, and of offshore or land pipelines between well-head and terminal. Other land pipelines are classified to Group 140 if feeding a refinery, Group 162 if part of the distribution of gas, Group 612 if part of the distribution of fuel or Group 726 if operated on a fee or contract basis.

The information in this report relates to establishments classified to the Extraction of mineral oil and natural gas industry, Group 130 in the

Standard Industrial Classification Revised 1980. The industry Group covers the following Activity Heading:—

⁽a) The figures in this table differ from those published elsewhere for Gross Domestic Fixed Capital Formation of the industry. Imported items are included in capital formation when they arrived in this country. In most cases this happens during the same period as payment is made. However, for items with a lengthy construction period e.g. off-shore platforms, expenditure may be spread over several years, causing the two series to diverge.

⁽b) Average number employed during the year, including full and part-time employees.

⁽c) The cost of employers' contributions to the national insurance, graduated pensions, other pensions and welfare schemes and the running costs of canteens, is estimated for the industry at £30.0 million.

⁽b) Capital expenditure in respect of fields where production had not commenced before the end of the year, is included.

⁽c) Including off-shore production platforms, production and appraisal wells, tanker off-shore loading systems, pipelines and terminals. The cost of installing these items is also included.

NOTES

These notes give the information needed for interpreting the figures published in this Business Monitor alone; more detailed information about the Census of Production in general is given in a separate Business Monitor — PA1001 (Introductory Notes) of the Report on the Census of Production, 1981.

STATISTICAL UNITS

The statistical unit for the purpose of this industry is the undertaking, which includes the holders of petroleum exploration and production licences, and the activities of companies providing services unique to this industry. Holders of licences are required to provide separate information for each individual field or project, and where licensees operate in consortia, the bulk of the information is derived from returns submitted by the operator of the consortium. Because of this complex consortium and company organisation of UK Continental Shelf development, the enterprise unit used in the census generally has little meaning in this industry and is not used.

SOURCES OF INFORMATION

The information published in this Business Monitor is supplied primarily by the Department of Energy. Most of this information is derived from quarterly inquiries conducted by the Business Statistics Office on behalf of the Department of Energy, which collect similar information to that collected in the Census of Production for other industries. The inquiry addressed to holders of seaward and landward licences is an administrative inquiry conducted under the terms of these licences issued under the Petroleum and Submarine Pipe-lines Act, 1975. The inquiries addressed to Contractors and to holders of exploration licences are conducted under the Statistics of Trade Act, 1947.

DERIVED STATISTICS

Gross Value Added for this industry is calculated as the difference between total revenues and current (exploration and operating) expenditures having first deducted from total current expenditures the amounts reported to be operating wages and salaries. The wages and salaries reported at table 1 are, however, the total wages and salaries of the industry and may include those of employees directly engaged in exploration or development activity.

In line with the changed treatment recently adopted for the National Accounts, Royalties and licence fees are no longer deducted in the computation of Gross Value Added. Revised figures for 1976—8 on this basis are available on application to Branch EcSD of the Department of Energy.

Operating ratios such as gross value added per head are not computed for this industry where, because of the large amounts of capital employed and the special nature of UK Continental Shelf development, they would have little meaning.
