## 141 Miscellaneous manufactures of paper and board

This Report on the Miscellaneous Manufactures of Paper and Board Industry relates to establishments engaged wholly or mainly in the printing of wallpaper (including coated wallpaper) and manufacturing paper, cardboard and papier maché goods, other than paper bags and multiwall paper sacks, stationery, cardboard boxes, cartons and fibre-board packing cases.

This industry corresponds to minimum list heading 484 in the Standard Industrial Classification (Revised 1968) which has been used for the first time as a basis of classification in the 1968 Census.

The industry formed part of the Miscellaneous Manufactures of Paper and Board Industry (Part 116) in the Reports on the last detailed Census of Production for 1963 corresponding to the sub-divisions 'Wallpaper' and 'Remainder of the industry'. The manufacture of paper bags and multiwall paper sacks and stationery included in the industry in the 1963 Report are now shown as separate Reports for 1968 as 'Packaging Products of Paper and Associated Materials (0ther Than Board)' (Part 139) and Manufactured Stationery (Part 140) respectively.

Throughout this Report, the figures given for 1963 have been reclassified, as far as possible, according to the Standard Industrial Classification (Revised 1968) so that data for 1963 and 1968 are on the same industrial basis. However the reclassification of small firms, which provided limited information only, has been arbitrary.

In interpreting the data in the tables it is essential to bear in mind the notes and definitions which appear on pages (i) to (iv).
