## NARROW FABRICS TRADE

THIS REPORT on the Narrow Fabrics Trade relates to establishments engaged wholly or mainly in he manufacture of braids, webs, ribbons, trimmings and tapes (including those containing elastic). and in the manufacture of woven machinery belting.

Firms mainly engaged in making upholstery trimmings were not covered in 1937; in 1935 returns were received from 16 such firms whose net output was about 6 per cent. of the total for all firms. This trade corresponds to minimum list heading 121 in the Standard Industrial Classification
