Notes on the Index

- 1 This index includes an A to Z subject index for the year, and subject or chronological listings for each section of the journal. In addition, there is a listing of features that have been published from November 1995 to 1998. There is also an alphabetical list of feature authors.
- 2 The A to Z subject index covers the whole of the journal apart from the labour market data appearing in the pink pages, which are in standard form each month. It therefore includes references not only to main features but also to Parliamentary Questions, news reports, research briefs and books under appropriate subject headings, and to the Labour Market Update and Spotlight sections.
- 3 *Labour Market Trends* replaced *Employment Gazette* in November 1995 when the Central Statistical Office (CSO) took over from the Department of Employment responsibility for publishing statistics on the labour market. In April 1996 the CSO merged with the Office of Population Censuses and Surveys to form the Office for National Statistics (ONS).
