134 Shop and office fittings

This Report on the Shop and Office Fittings Industry relates to establishments engaged wholly or mainly in manufacturing office, shop, bank, bar and hotel fittings, show cases, exhibition and display stands, shop fronts, shop blinds, wood shutters, etc. Installation of these fittings is included as is also signwriting and lettering.

This industry corresponds to minimum list heading 474 in the Standard Industrial Classification (Revised 1968) which has been used for the first time as a basis of classification in the 1968 Census. The definition of this industry however is unchanged from the last detailed Census of Production for 1963 in which it was reported (Part 111).

In this industry, where small establishments account for a relatively large proportion of employment and output, establishments employing fewer than twenty-five persons were asked to complete a simplified version of the full census form for 1968. For 1963 a sample of small firms was asked to complete the simplified census form, the remainder being required only to give information on employment and description of business.

In interpreting the data in the tables it is essential to bear in mind the notes and definitions which appear on pages (i) to (iv).
