This Report on the Fur Industry relates to establishments engaged wholly or mainly in sorting, dressing and dyeing furs and in manufacturing fur apparel, fur muffs, fur trimmings, fur mats and rugs and hatters' fur. Workrooms attached to retail shops are excluded.

This industry corresponds to minimum list heading 433 in the Standard Industrial Classification (Revised 1968) which has been used for the first time as a basis of classification in the 1968 Census. The definition of this industry however is unchanged from the last detailed Census of Production for 1963 in which it was reported (Part 92).

In this industry, where small establishments account for a relatively large proportion of employment and output, establishments employing fewer than twenty-five persons were asked to complete a simplified version of the full census form.

In interpreting the data in the tables it is essential to bear in mind the notes and definitions which appear on pages (i) to (iv).
