Packaging products of paper and associated materials (other than board)

This Report on the Packaging Products of Paper and Associated Materials (other than board) Industry relates to establishments engaged wholly or mainly in manufacturing paper bags, including printed bags, multiwall paper sacks, etc.

This industry corresponds to minimum list heading 482(2) in the Standard Industrial Classification (Revised 1968) which has been used for the first time as a basis of classification in the 1968 Census.

The industry formed part of the Miscellaneous Manufactures of Paper and Board Industry (Part 116) in the Reports on the last detailed Census of Production for 1963 corresponding in the main to the sub-division on 'Paper bags and multiwall paper sacks' but also including articles manufactured from transparent regenerated cellulose film and other packaging products of paper and associated materials (other than board). The manufacture of stationery, wallpaper and other manufactures of paper and cardboard also included in the industry in the 1963 Report are now shown as separate reports for 1968 as Manufactured Stationery (Part 140) and Miscellaneous Manufactures of Paper and Board (Part 141).

Throughout this Report, the figures given for 1963 have been reclassified, as far as possible, according to the Standard Industrial Classification (Revised 1968) so that data for 1963 and 1968 are on the same industrial basis. However the reclassification of small firms, which provided limited information only, has been arbitrary.

In interpreting the data in the tables it is essential to bear in mind the notes and definitions which appear on pages (i) to (iv).
