This Report on the Telegraph and Telephone Apparatus and Equipment Industry relates to establishments engaged wholly or mainly in manufacturing telegraph and telephone apparatus, switchboards, teleprinters, telewriters, etc including electronic telecommunications equipment.

This industry corresponds to minimum list heading 363 in the Standard Industrial Classification (Revised 1968) which has been used for the first time as a basis of classification in the 1968 Census.

The industry corresponds to the Telegraph and Telephone Apparatus Industry (Part 57) in the Reports on the last detailed Census of Production for 1963, except that electronic telecommunications was not specifically included and burglar and fire alarm manufacture and traffic control equipment for roads or inland waterways formerly included in this industry are now included in the report on the Radio, Radar and Electronic Capital Goods Industry (Part 77).

Throughout this Report, the figures given for 1963 have been reclassified, as far as possible, according to the Standard Industrial Classification (Revised 1968) so that data for 1963 and 1968 are on the same industrial basis. However the reclassification of small firms, which provided limited information only, has been arbitrary.

In interpreting the data in the tables it is essential to bear in mind the notes and definitions which appear on pages (i) to (iv).
