## 121 Hats, caps and millinery

This Report on the Hats, Caps and Millinery Industry relates to establishments engaged wholly or mainly in manufacturing wool felt, fur felt and imitation fur hats, hoods and capelines, and all sorts of headgear (except fur hats) for adults and children, but not those made up from knitted fabric by establishments classified to the Hosiery and 0ther Knitted Goods Industry (Part 104). Made-up linings etc, for headgear are also included but workrooms attached to retail shops are excluded.

This industry corresponds to minimum list heading 446 in the Standard Industrial Classification (Revised 1968) which has been used for the first time as a basis of classification in the 1968 Census. The definition of this industry however is unchanged from the last detailed Census of Production for 1963 in which it was reported (Part 98).
In this industry, where small establishments account for a relatively large proportion of employment and output, establishments employing fewer than twentyfive persons were asked to complete a simplified version of the full census form.

In interpreting the data in the tables it is essential to bear in mind the notes and definitions which appear on pages (i) to (iv).
