## tea blending and coffee roasting trades

THIS REPORT on the Tea Blending and Coffee Roasting Trades relates to establishments engaged wholly or mainly in blending tea and roasting coffee. Establishments mainly engaged in manufacturing coffee and chicory extracts and essences are excluded.
The establishments in these trades are included in minimum list heading 242 (1) in the
Standard Industrial Classification.
These trades were not covered in 1937 or 1935. For the year 1950 Census of Production returns were required, in Great Britain, only from establishments that sold no merchanted goods nor undertook retailing during the year; other establishments (i.e., those which engaged in merchanting or retailing as well as production) made returns in the Census of Distribution only. In these trades, therefore, information for 1950 comparable to tha: for any other year is not available.

IMPORTANT NOTES and definitions appear on the inside of the back cover of this report. In interpreting the data in the following tables it is essential to bear these in mind.
