\section*{Plastic goods and fancy articles trade}

THIS REPORT on the Plastic Goods and Fancy Articles Trade relates to establishment engad whe engaged wholly or mainly in the manufacture of electr' requisites, lampshades (except glass), and naterials, hard haberdashery (except metal), smokers accessories and fittings wholly or partly of plastic materials for the Motor Vehicle and Cycle Mechomical amd Electrical Engineering, Radio and Telecommunication, Scientific, Surgical and Photographic Instruments and Watch and Clock Trades is, so far as has been found practicable Photographic Instruments and Watch and lock the appropriate parent trade. Establishments excluded from this trade and classified to the appre than of glass were not covered by the 1937 specialising in the manufacture of lampshades otiner to the sections of the trade included in the 1937 Inquiry as well as full totals for 1935

This trade corresponds to minimum list heading \(199(1)\) and part of \(199(3)\) in the Standard Industrial Classification.

Any establishments in thị trade in Northern Ireland were excluded in 1948; no production was recorded there in this trade for 1937 or 1935.
