## 119 Overalls and men's shirts, underwear, etc.

This Report on the Overalls and Men's Shirts, Underwear, etc Industry relates to establishments engaged wholly or mainly in manufacturing men's and women's industrial overalls, dungarees, jeans and similar garments, chefs' clothing, etc, men's and boys' shirts, collars, pyjamas, dressing gowns, underclothing, athletic clothing, etc. The making-up of clothes cut from purchased knitted fabric is included but not the manufacture of knitted goods by establishments classified to the Hosiery and Other Knitted Goods Industry (Part 104). Workrooms attached to retail shops are excluded.

This industry corresponds to minimum list heading 444 in the Standard Industrial Classification (Revised 1968) which has been used for the first time as a basis of classification in the 1968 Census.

The industry corresponds to the Overalls and Men's Shirts, Underwear, etc Industry (Part 96) in the Reports on the last detailed Census of Production for 1963, except that trousers and shorts made on 2 or 3 needle machines formerly included in the Men's and Boys' Tailored Outerwear Industry (Part 94) and heavy overalls and aprons made from rubber or plastics formerly included in the Rubber Industry (Part 119) are now included in this industry.

Throughout this Report, the figures given for 1963 have been reclassified, as far as possible, according to the Standard Industrial Classification (Revised 1968) so that data for 1963 and 1968 are on the same industrial basis. However the reclassification of small firms, which provided limited information only, has been arbitrary.

In interpreting the data in the tables it is essential to bear in mind the notes and definitions which appear on pages (i) to (iv).
