## 37 Polishes

This Report on the Polishes Industry relates to establishments engaged wholly or mainly in the manufacture of wax and other polishes of all types (except french polish) for leather, wood or metal. Impregnated polishing cloths and sponges etc, are included.
This industry corresponds to minimum list heading 279(1) in the Standard Industrial Classification (Revised 1968) which has been used for the first time as a basis of classification in the 1968 census. The definition of this industry however is unchanged from the last detailed Census of Production for 1963 in which it was reported (Part 35).
There were no larger establishments in this industry in Northern Ireland in 1963 and 1968.

In interpreting the data in the tables it is essential to bear in mind the notes and definitions which appear on pages (i) to (iv).
