## BISCUIT TRADE

## INTRODUCTORY

This trade comprises firms that were engaged wholly or mainly in the manufacture of biscuits.

The figures previously published in respect of 1934 have been amended throughout by the addition of particulars of certain important firms whose returns had not been included. The principal figures recorded for 1934 by these firms were as follows:-
