WHOLESALE SLAUGHTERING TRADE

THIS REPORT on the Wholesale Slaughtering Trade relates to abattoirs and wholesale slaughterhouses controlled by the Ministry of Food irrespective of the number of persons employed. Slaughterhouses for killing animals not for human consumption are excluded. The information given relates, therefore, to livestock purchased by the Ministry of Food, subsequently slaughtered and sold as meat (including offal) for human consumption, hides and skins and gut. Pigs slaughtered by curers for bacon are not included. No operatives are directly employed by the Ministry of Food, killing being done on behalf of the Ministry by contractors at fixed payments.

The subsidy figure in Table 1 represents an adjustment to balance the loss incurred on sales at approved wholesale prices and sufficient to leave a net output equal to the cost of salaries, employers' share of contributions to all National Insurance Schemes, rent, tolls and other expenses.

This trade, which was not covered in 1935, corresponds to minimum list heading 153(1) in the Standard Industrial Classification.
