These trades comprise firms that were engaged wholly or mainly in the manufacture of cattle, dog and poultry foods, except cereal feeding stuffs produced by grain milling firms (see page 23) and oil-seed cake manufactured by seed-crushing firms (see page 362).

In Ig24 the value of the gross output of the small firms was 5.2 per cent. of the total, the principal items affected being oil-seed cake, ground or mixed, $£ 132,000$ ( 29.8 per cent.), and unsweetened feeding stuffs for animals, other than oil-seed cake and dog and poultry foods, £IIO,000 ( $6 \cdot 0$ per cent.).

## THE ICE TRADE INTRODUCTORY

This trade comprises firms that were engaged in the manufacture of for sale. Firms that made ice for their own use, e.g., for cold ice fore instructed to exclude all ice so used storage or fish preserving, were instructed to exclude all ice from their statements of output. Ice purchased and re-sold in the same condition as received, or merely cut into blocks, was also excluded.
