
#### Abstract

This Report on the Gloves Industry relates to establishments engaged wholly or mainly in manufacturing all types of corts, loather or fur glo

This industry corresponds to minimum list heading 449(2) in the Standard Industrial Classification (Revised 1968) which has been used for the first time as a basis of classification in the 1968 Census. The definition of this industry however is  reported (Part 100).

All firms in this industry were asked to state the number of outworkers emp loyed and the estimated totals are shown in footnote (d) to Table 1. Figures for the number of outworkers attached to larger firms employing twenty-five or more persons and the payments made to them are shown for both years in footnotes (g) and


 (i) to Table 4.In interpreting the data in the tables it is essential to bear in mind the notes and definitions which appear on pages (i) to (iv).
