THIS REPORT on the Wooden Containers and Baskets Trade relates to establishments engaged wholly or mainly in the manufacture of cooperage products and parts, of wooden boxes, packing cases and similar containers, in preparing canes and osiers, and in manufacturing baskets, hampers, punnets, etc.

This trade corresponds to minimum list heading 173 in the Standard Industrial Classification.

Philanthropic institutions that produced basketware are included in this report for 1948; they were not required to make returns for 1935.

Establishments in this trade in Northern Ireland are excluded in 1948 and 1935, particulars of the very small production there for 1935 being included in the report on the Timber Trade (Volume 10, Trade A).
