This Report on the Men's and Boys' Tailored 0uterwear Industry relates, to establishments engaged wholly or mainly in manufacturing men s, youths and boys' overcoats, suits, jackets, trousers, kilts, uniforms, liveries, whether ready-made or to measure. Clerical (cassocks, surpilices, etc), excluded. Retail bespoke tailoring and workrooms attached to retail shops are also excluded.
This industry corresponds to minimum list heading 442 in the Standard Industrial Classification (Revised 1968) which has been used for the first time as a basis of classification in the 1968 Census
The industry corresponds to the Men's and Boys' Tailored Outerwear Industry (Part 94) in the Reports on the last detailed Census of Production for 1963,
except that trousers and shorts made on 2 or 3 needle machines formerly included except that trousers and shorts made on 2 or 3 needle machines formerly included in this Report are now included in the ond other uniforms and women's and girls leather clothing also formerly included in this Report are now included in the leather clothing a, so former Outerwear Industry (Part 118). Throughout this Report, the figures given for 1963 have been reclassif ied, as
far as possible, according to the Standard Industrial Classification (Revised 1968) so that data for 1963 and 1968 are on the same industrial basis. However the reclassification of small firms, which provided limited information only, has been arbitrary.

In interpreting the data in the tables it is essential to bear in mind the notes and definitions which appear on pages (i) to (iv).
