This trade comprises firms (including co-operative societies) engaged wholly or mainly in the baking of bread, cakes, pastries, etc., and the manufacture of ice-cream.

The Census form for 1935 required bakers to confine their returns of employment to persons that were employed in the bakehouse or were required in connection with the sale and delivery of their own products to customers; firms that were also concerned in retailing goods not of their own manufacture, and those that maintained refreshment rooms.

were instructed to omit from their returns all employees (shop assistants, waitresses, etc.) that were engaged chiefly in connection with these services. This instruction was not followed by many of the smaller bakers, with the result that the total number of employees recorded considerably over-stated the number actually required for "production", in the sense in which that term is used for Census purposes. A similar difficulty arose at each of the previous Censuses, and in view of the large number of businesses involved and the frequent lack of records, it has not been possible to arrive at a precise figure for any year. The number of firms recorded as in this trade is known to be considerably over-stated for the year 1930 owing to the inclusion of certain firms concerned in the distribution of bakery products but not themselves bakers. The numbers of persons employed given in the following table have been partly estimated and should be regarded as only approximate.

Total output of bread, cakes, pastries, etc.—Particulars of the total quantity and value of bread and the value of cakes, pastries, etc., made in the United Kingdom in the years 1935, 1930 and 1924 are given in the following table, bread in rolls being expressed in 4-lb. loaves at its equivalent weight and the unclassified output divided *pro rata*. The estimates for the small firms in 1935 are based partly on the particulars of the number of 4-lb. loaves made and of sacks of flour used, which were supplied by a representative sample of firms for that year.

The estimated total quantity of bread produced at bakeries in 1924 represents an average consumption of about 149 lbs. per head of the population of the United Kingdom; for 1930 the average was 148 lbs. and for 1935 150 lbs.

Table VI.—Average value of bread

The average value of all bread for which quantities were recorded for 1930 was 7.71d. per 4-lb. loaf, bread made in loaves of smaller size than 4 lbs., and in rolls, being expressed in 4-lb. loaves at its equivalent weight. Owing to possible variations in the proportions sold in the different forms, a precise comparison cannot be made with the values recorded for 1935, which were as follows:—

The average retail price of bread, as recorded by the Ministry of Labour, was about 9 per cent. lower in 1935 than in 1930 and this price fall is confirmed by a comparison of the returns for the two years of the largest firms which did not record any output of rolls in 1935. The fall between 1930 and 1935 in the average value of the flour produced in this country, including the Wheat Quota payment in the 1935 price, was about 11 per cent.
