## 113 Leather (tanning and dressing) and fellmongery

This Report on the Leather (Tanning and Dressing) and Fellmongery Industry relates to establishments engaged wholly or mainly in curing, degreasing, tanning, and leather laces; and in removing the wool from sheepskins and lambskins and making sheepskin mats and rugs.
This industry corresponds to minimum list heading 431 in the Standard Industrial Classification (Revised 1968) which has been used for the first time as a basis of unchanged from the last detailed Census reported (Part 90).
METHOD OF CLASSIFICATION
The classification of returns to this industry followed the standard procedure as outlined in the notes on page (i).
In classifying returns to the sub-divisions of the industry shown in Table 4 a 'Tanning and dressing', 'Machinery belting etc' or 'Fellmongery'. 'Tanning' 'Tanning and dressing', 'Machinery belting etc' or 'Fellmongery'. Returns classified to 'Dressing' if the return indicated thessing' were subsequentl in tanning or otherwise producing undressed leather (whether or not for sale as such) at any establishment covered by the return.
