113 Leather (tanning and dressing) and fellmongery

This Report on the Leather (Tanning and Dressing) and Fellmongery Industry relates to establishments engaged wholly or mainly in curing, degreasing, tanning, dyeing, etc all types of hides and skins; in making leather machinery belting and leather laces; and in removing the wool from sheepskins and lambskins and making sheepskin mats and rugs.

This industry corresponds to minimum list heading 431 in the Standard Industrial Classification (Revised 1968) which has been used for the first time as a basis of classification in the 1968 Census. The definition of this industry however is unchanged from the last detailed Census of Production for 1963 in which it was reported (Part 90).

METHOD OF CLASSIFICATION

The classification of returns to this industry followed the standard procedure as outlined in the notes on page (i).

In classifying returns to the sub-divisions of the industry shown in Table 4 a similar procedure was followed in first allocating each return to 'Tanning', 'Tanning and dressing', 'Machinery belting etc' or 'Fellmongery'. Returns primarily allocated in this way to 'Tanning and dressing' were subsequently classified to 'Dressing' if the return indicated that the firm was not engaged in tanning or otherwise producing undressed leather (whether or not for sale as such) at any establishment covered by the return.

In interpreting the data in the tables it is essential to bear in mind the notes and definitions which appear on pages (i) to (iv).
