## 33 Soap and detergents

This Report on the Soap and Detergents Industry relates to establishments engaged wholly or mainly in manufacturing soaps, soap powder, soap flakes, shaving soap or cream, soapless detergents, scouring preparations, primary products of sperm oil (including higher fatty alcohols), stearine, glycerine, candles, night-lights and tapers; fat splitting and distillation.

This industry corresponds to minimum list heading 275 in the Standard Industrial Classification (Revised 1968) which has been used for the first time as a basis of classification in the 1968 Census.

The industry corresponds to the Soap, Detergents, Candles and Glycerine Industry (Part 33) in the Reports on the last detailed Census of Production for 1963 except that higher fatty alcohols were shown in the Report on General Chemicals (Part 27).

Throughout this Report the figures given for 1963 have been reclassified, as far as possible, according to the Standard Industrial Classification (Revised 1968) so that data for 1963 and 1968 are on the same industrial basis. However the reclassification of small firms, which provided limited information only, has been arbitrary.

There were no larger establishments in this industry in Northern Ireland in 1963 and 1968.

In interpreting the data in the tables it is essential to bear in mind the notes and definitions which appear on pages (i) to (iv).
