38 Formulated adhesives, gelatine, etc.

This Report on the Formulated Adhesives, Gelatine, etc Industry relates to establishments engaged wholly or mainly in manufacturing formulated synthetic resin adhesives (ie containing solvents, plasticisers etc) and gelatine, glue, size, gum, paste etc including preliminary processes such as scraping and crushing of bones and grinding gums and natural resins. Rubber adhesives are also included but unformulated synthetic resin adhesives are excluded.

This industry corresponds to minimum list heading 279(2) in the Standard Industrial Classification (Revised 1968) which has been used for the first time as a basis of classification in the 1968 Census.

The industry corresponds to the Gelatine, Adhesives, etc Industry (Part 36) in the Reports on the last detailed Census of Production for 1963 except that formulated rubber adhesives were shown in the Report on Rubber (Part 119).

Throughout this Report the figures given for 1963 have been reclassified as far as possible according to the Standard Industrial Classification (Revised 1968) so that data for 1963 and 1968 are on the same industrial basis. However the reclassification of small firms, which provided limited information only, has been arbitrary.

In interpreting the data in the tables it is essential to bear in mind the notes and definitions which appear on pages (i) to (iv).
