25 Mineral oil refining

This Report on the Mineral Oil Refining Industry relates to establishments engaged wholly or mainly in refining petroleum or shale oil, and producing bitumen, medicinal paraffin, paraffin wax, petroleum jelly, etc. The blending of mineral, animal or vegetable lubricating oils, and greases carried out at refineries is also included but the sales are shown in the report on the Lubricating Oils and Greases Industry (Part 26).

This industry corresponds to minimum list heading 262 in the Standard Industrial Classification (Revised 1968) which has been used for the first time as a basis of classification in the 1968 Census. The definition of this industry however is unchanged from the last detailed Census of Production for 1963 in which it was reported (Part 23), except that butane and propane for use as fuel was included in the report on the General Chemicals Industry (Part 27).

The figures have been compiled from returns made to the Ministry of Power. Sales are generally valued at open market prices f.o.b.in the Gulf of Mexico plus current rates of freight and insurance to the United Kingdom, and purchases of feedstock are valued at open market prices f.o.b. at the port of origin plus current rates of freight and insurance to the United Kingdom. The size of the net output is largely determined by methods of valuation.

Returns in full detail were received from all establishments in this industry, there being no establishment employing less than 25 persons in 1963 or 1968 for which a separate return could be made; all the tables in this report therefore relate to the industry as a whole.

In interpreting the data in the tables it is essential to bear in mind the notes and definitions which appear on pages (i) to (iv).
