## We're better off IN Europe

On June 23, you will be asked to make a choice: should Britain remain a member of the European Union, or should we leave? Our decision will have a huge impact on our country's future. Wimbledon Labour believe in standing up for people in our community whose jobs and communities depend on trade with Europe.

Three million British jobs are tied to our trade with Europe. Those jobs depend on our ability to export goods to other countries in the European Union. If we leave Europe, nobody knows what our future trading relationship with the EU would be, but it would almost certainly be worse.

Rights like paid maternity and paternity leave, rights
for agency workers, and equal pay for men and
women are guaranteed because Britain is in the EU.

If we leave, all those rights could be ripped apart by a

#### Crossrail 2 - The fight to save our Town Centre continues

Over the last few months we have seen both public and political concern about the current set of proposals for Crossrail 2 in Wimbledon. There is cross party agreement that whilst Crossrail 2 could bring benefits to the town centre this cannot be at any cost.

Speaking recently to the Wimbledon Guardian Michelle Dix, Managing Director of Crossrail 2 admitted that 'there was no easy solution for Wimbledon,' but they that had listened to the mounting concern.

Merton's Labour Council has strenuously objected to the current set of proposals and Cllr Stephen Alambritis, Leader of the Council, is seeking an urgent meeting with the new Mayor of London, Sadiq Khan to outline the objections.



With updated proposals expected in Autumn 2016 it is important that we continue to be clear that we want a vision for Wimbledon that works for residents and businesses. Crossrail 2 could help us to deliver on this ambition but it must not be at any cost.

We must keep up the pressure to ensure that when Autumn comes Crossrail 2 are persuaded that they need to safeguard Wimbledon's future.

### WINNING FOR LABOUR - SADIQ KHAN AND LEONIE COOPER

Thank you to Wimbledon residents who came out to vote in the London elections on May 5th and helped us to put Sadiq Khan in as Labour Mayor and Leonie Cooper in as Merton & Wandsworth GLA Assembly Member. We are delighted that both Sadiq and Leonie, who have both been so vocal in their concerns for Wimbledon Town Centre under Crossrail 2's proposals are now leading in City Hall.

Leonie Cooper beat the tory candidate by 4,301 votes when the results were declared and Sadig secured the largest majority ever for a London Mayor - a whopping 1,310,143 votes.

We look forward to working with them both in the coming months not only on Crossrail 2 but across pivitol issues of housing, policing and of course the return of AFC Wimbledon.
