#### Forthcoming Article on UK's Targeted Killing Policy

Earlier this month the Attorney General, Jeremy Wright QC, outlined how the UK Government understood its legal right to self-defence against non-state groups. In his speech Wright presented a much more expansive definition of an "imminent threat" a key criterion in assessing whether or not a state can legally use force in self-defence.
