## Part VI.-Sickness and Infirmities of the People.

217. The instructions given on the Householders' Schedules for the guidance of persons, in recording information relating to the Sickness and Infirmities of the People, were as follows :"If permanently unable to follow any occupation by reason of Illness or Accident, state the cause, or if Deaf and Dumb, Blind, Insane, Idiotic, Epileptic, Paralytic, Leprous, Lost a Limb, or Lost an Eye, as the case may be."
218. This Table shows the Sickness and Infirmities, of all "Europeans or Whites," for each Part VI. Magisterial Division or Centre separately, and the Colony as a whole, from which it will be seen that 571 persons are recorded as suffering from various ailments, or 0.58 per cent. of the total European Population.
219. This Table gives similar information in relation to the "Indians and Asiatics" with a Table I. total of 357 persons, or 0.35 per cent.
220. Refers to "Mixed and Others" only, with 51 persons, or 0.76 per cent.

Sickness and Infirmities of the People.
221. This Table is a Summary of the same information for the three different Races com- Table I. bined, which gives a record of 979 persons suffering from various ailments, or 0.47 per cent. of See Annexures. the total population, "Europeans or Whites," "Indians and Asiatics," and "Mixed and Others."
222. The exceptionally large number of "Insane" people in the Municipality of Pieter- Government maritzburg is accounted for by the fact that within the Municipal boundaries is situated the Asylum, Government Asylum, the only one in the Colony. Within its precincts are domiciled no less than 331 persons in various stages of Insanity, of which 204 are "Europeans or Whites," 106 "Indians and Asiatics," and 21 "Mixed and Others."
223. In addition to the above Nationalities, details (which are shown separately at the foot Native of the Summary of Infirmities), was given by the Asylum Authorities of 175 Native Lunatics.
224. Information regarding "Sickness and Infirmities" of the People is always of great value in every Civilised Community, and we have no reason to believe that this information was, to any extent, withheld; on the contrary, numbers of minor ailments were recorded, which for statistical purposes were, to say the least, amusing.

247．As the information required under this head is so elaborate，we would suggest a Instructions reference to the Special Industrial
Schedules，at end of the Report．

248．Considerable difficulty was experienced with this particular Form，in some instances ondedied owing to inattention to the detailed instructions，or lack of understanding of same；and other instances to the wording of the Census $A$ ct，which was not sufficiently clear，from a legal point，to enable us to insist upon the necessary information being recorded．

24．It is gratifying to know that our enumerators were not met with many objections；Objections there were a few people who refused to give the necessary particulars concerning＂value of
materials＂used and＂value of articles produced＂；however，these are so few in number as to materials material difference to a record which at best，can only be approximate

250．Numbers of the Forms were returned to the various Districts for amendment，after Forms scrutiny in the Head Office，some of the entries being so apparently incorrect．For the Munici－ pality of Pietermaritzburg，a comparison of the Industrial Institutions with the Local Directory，
revealed a number of places that had been overlooked，so that a Special Officer was engaged further upon this work until the returns were completed．The same applies to Durban，and to avoid endless correspondence and delay our Chief Clerk was sent down and personally superintended the work．
