Sir,

I have been directed by the Executive Committee of the above mentioned Society to say that the Church League for Women's Suffrage desires to put part of its salaried staff and central offices at the disposal of the Government, as a voluntary contribution for relief or other patriotic work, during the present distress.

The Staff includes (a) an organizer accustomed to social work, correspondence, travelling, and dealing with all classes of people; (b) an expert shorthand typist; (c) a junior clerk familiar with files and general office work.

The offices include three rooms, two on the ground floor and one on the 2nd. floor, with office furniture and telephone. Office hours are 9.30.a.m. to 5.30.p.m. daily; Saturdays 9.30. to 1.0. o'clock.
