My dear Mrs Fawcett

I enclose a copy of
a letter of Dr Whewell's which

Mr Hammond. If not, will you
ask him to mention in writing
to me the month and year of
the letter he has.

I am much obliged to you
for telling me of the payment
for the Scholarship; I enclose

a cheque for it. I can find no trace of any second payment ever having been made; if not, a third is still due, and if so I should be glad to know, that I may not omit to send it.

I enclose also a cheque for the Association for the Higher Education of Women of which I should be glad to be a member.

Will you tell me

what you think of a scheme of Miss Jex Blake about which I have just received a letter from her - a scheme for collecting £10,000 in order to offer ~~to found~~ "additional endowment" to some university to induce it to admit women to the study of medicine.

You sent me too much

for the overcharge of your
letter; the French always
subtract what has been
already paid from the
double charge for an
underpaid letter, and therefore
it only cost me fivepence.
