# UNION OF JEWISH WOMEN.

## SEVENTEENTH ANNUAL REPORT, 1920.

In presenting their seventeenth Annual Report, the Committee are happy to note increasing activity in all departments of the work of the Union—social, educational and philanthropic. They attribute much of this to the representative character of the Union under its amended Constitution; for it must now be recognised that the Committee's plea in the past for greater co-operation among all societies and organisations working in the interests of women and children, has been fully justified; and they trust that the report will satisfy the Members that much has been done during the past year to secure the well-being and advancement of women, both as Jewesses and as citizens of this great country. Twenty-nine representative Societies are now affiliated to the Union, the Baroness de Hirsch Convalescent Home being the latest adherent, and the Council has been further strengthened by three ladies representing the additional members of the Union of Jewish Women.

The new Treasurer, Mrs. Ernest Lesser, has by her zeal and energy succeeded in enrolling many new subscribers and the Committee gratefully acknowledge her efforts.

The resignation of Miss Ida Samuel from the Executive Committee owing to stress of other work, has been received with sincere regret. Mrs. F. D. Benjamin and Mrs. F. S. Franklin have joined the Executive Committee this year and have strengthened its work by their active support.

Miss Daisy Adler has withdrawn from the representation of the West Central Girls' Club on the Council and Mrs. Kino has been nominated as the Club's representative.

Mrs. Langenbach has accepted nomination as one of the Vice-Presidents.

The Committee deeply deplore the great loss they have sustained by the deaths of Mrs. Henry Simmons, of Bristol, and Mme. M. Kiefe, of Paris. Both ladies had given devoted help in their respective towns since the inception of the Union in 1902. It was through the late Mrs. Simmons' active interest that the arrangements for the Bristol Jewish meeting in the Autumn were initiated, and the Committee are grateful for all she did in the cause of the Union.

The ever ready assistance accorded by the Union's correspondents is gratefully acknowledged.

A short leaflet has been prepared which has proved useful in furthering activities in the Provinces and in enrolling new members, and which is obtainable upon inquiry at the Office.

**Annual General Meeting.** The Annual General Meeting for the adoption of the Report and Balance Sheets was held on February 9th by kind invitation of Mrs. Tanburn, when interesting and stimulating addresses were given by Mrs. Auerbach and Miss Hannah F. Cohen, O.B.E., on the "Need for Jewish Women to Study their New Responsibilities." On the same occasion Mes. Melzer and Rothfeld, by special request, were allowed to appeal



on behalf of the war orphans in Galicia. Their eloquence, and the sad plight of the children for whom they pleaded, had an immediate response. The Union's collection eventually amounted to £1,900. To this sum the Government grant has been added and the whole amounts have been transmitted to Galicia.

**Meetings.** The Council meeting held on May 31st by kind invitation of Mrs. F.C. Stern, was devoted to a discussion on "The Women's Part in the Jewish War Memorial," and the members voted in favour of participating in the movement. This resulted in the initiation of the Women's Million Shilling Fund of the Jewish War Memorial, of which further mention is made later.

Mrs. Nathaniel Harris, President of the Council of Jewish Women of U.S.A., and Vice-President of the National Council of Women of U.S.A., paid a visit to London in the early Autumn. In response to an invitation by the President, as many of the members of the Council as were in Town attended a meeting at her house on October 2nd, in order to give Mrs. Nathaniel Harris an opportunity of becoming personally acquainted with representative social workers in London. Mrs. Harris gave an interesting account of her visit to Christiania as one of the American delegates at the Conference of the International Council of Women; and described in vivid language the many-sided activities and wide spread influence of the Council of Jewish Women of U.S.A. Her project for an International Council of Jewish Women was received with close attention, but for the present the Council has decided not to proceed in the matter.

The Council meeting held on November 29th reported the progress of the Women's Million Shilling Fund and discussed proposals for its further advancement.

**The Women's Million Shilling Fund.** The Women's Million Shilling Fund of the Jewish War Memorial has been prominent in the deliberations of the Union this year. A Committee has been formed to map out a plan of cam-

paign during the autumn and winter and opportunities will be sought to speak on this subject at all suitable meetings in London and the Provinces. At the Jewish Meeting convened by the Bristol Branch under the Presidency of Mrs. A. J. Jacobs, and held during the week of the Conference of the National Council of Women (where the Union was represented by the President and by Mrs. Model and the Secretary), the President introduced the subject as one of the principal points of her address. Great interest was shown in the work of the Union and in the "Women's Million Shilling Fund," and promises of substantial donations were forthcoming on the part of the Bristol ladies.

Other subjects discussed at this meeting were "Infant Welfare," by Mrs. Model, and "The Need of Organised Recreation for the Adolescent," by Mrs. Leslie Jacobs, of Newport.

A large meeting for the Women's Million Shilling Fund was arranged on October 17th, when Mrs. Hoster lent her fine rooms at 29, Grosvenor Place, S.W., and kindly presented the proceeds of the tea to the fund. The audience was addressed by Mrs. Spielman, Mrs. J. H. Hertz, Mr. A. I. Belisha (in the unavoidable absence of Sir Robert Waley Cohen), Mrs. Eichholz, Rev. W. Levin and Miss Teitleboam. Suggestions for increasing the present collection were proposed, and an anonymous donor has promised £100 if ten others will give or collect similar sums. The idea of a Children's Party, with magic lantern slides on the subject, was shortly after carried out successfully by Mrs. A. H. Levy, realising thereby further amounts. The drawing on the Leaflet for the Women's Million Shilling Fund was executed and presented to the Union by Miss Louise R. Jacobs, and has elicited warm admiration.

**Votes for Women Seatholders in the United Synagogue.** The Sub-Committee appointed to consider the best means of obtaining voting-power for the Women Seatholders of the United Synagogue, circularised the Boards of Management of the Constituent Synagogues on



"Election Sunday," in accordance with the plan adopted in previous years. A resolution in favour of the extension of the Synagogue franchise to such women as are Seat-holders in their own right, has now been proposed in all the Constituent Synagogues, and out of the eighteen Synagogues, the resolution has been passed by strong majorities in sixteen. A letter addressed by the President to the Hon. Officers of the Council of the United Synagogue on this subject has elicited the reply that a special Committee is sitting to consider the United Synagogue Scheme and Act, with a view to amending some of the provisions; and the Committee of the Union has now every hope that before long this much needed reform will be effected.

**Necessitous Ladies and other Funds.** Much of the work of the Union consists in forming and collecting funds as evidenced by the Union of Jewish Women's Million Shilling Fund and the Galician Orphans' Fund; but it is perhaps not generally known that the Union acts as Almoner on behalf of private donors. Thus allowances of £100, £60 and £24 a year are paid monthly, whilst sums amounting to £492 10s. 4d. for special cases have been disbursed, affording timely help to the Union's protégées when in bad health or past work.

The accounts of this "Fund" are submitted to the Auditor annually, but the delicate nature of the work makes it inadvisable to give further particulars in a general Report.

Support for the "Necessitous Ladies' Fund" in the shape of donations and gifts in kind is greatly needed; for these ladies are far removed from the ordinary recipients of charity and they are, as a class, inarticulate in their suffering.

The Committee gratefully acknowledge a legacy of £200 from the Executors of the late Miss Matilda Levy, and they plead for further help for this fund.

**Loan Funds.** The loans of the Union are mainly devoted to training, and the Committee are glad to record a good demand on the part of trainees. Loans

amounting to £222 11s. 4d. from the Union of Jewish Women's Loan Fund and the Louisa Lady Goldsmid Bequest Fund, have been granted for training and have been given to a teacher of dancing, an elocutionist, a student at London University, a secretary, a maternity nurse and for emigration expenses. The repayments have amounted to £154 13s. 0d.

The Union has ever impressed on its trainees the necessity for thorough training in the occupation selected, and it is becoming increasingly evident that only those thoroughly conversant with their work will succeed in obtaining remunerative and permanent posts.

The Union had forty-five trainees during the past year, all those who are in permanent work are repaying their debt to the Fund, while those who are still in training are making steady progress; six have completely repaid their loans. The Committee are gratified to report that during the whole period of fourteen years only three bad debts amounting to £20 have been incurred.

**Miscellaneous.** A proposal to assist in founding a Jewish house for girls attending Public Schools was brought forward by the Union and much propaganda was initiated on behalf of the movement. This effort did not materialise, but it brought the subject prominently before the community and an independent effort has resulted in the opening of a Jewish house in Cambridge.

An interesting course of Lectures on Social subjects was arranged by Miss Lucy Cohen, and held at her house. The educative work thus undertaken is one of the features of women's activities at present, and further courses will be planned as the demand arises.

**Library.** The revised Library Catalogue of the "Mrs. Nathaniel Lewis Cohen Memorial Library" was published in March, 1920, and has met with general approval for the instructive and helpful way in which the books have been classified. It is in demand both here and in the Colonies, and now



that the Library is open to members of the Union and their friends, it is hoped that good use will be made of the 500 volumes which have been collected mainly with a view to being of service to parents and teachers.

**Gifts.** Thanks are due to the London Needlework Guild for a gift of 200 garments, which will be given to poor ladies; and to the Grocery Fund for again arranging that parcels be despatched to several families fortnightly. Gifts of bread, meat and coal tickets have been greatly appreciated in these days of high coal prices and diminished purchasing powers.

**Executive and Case Committee.** The Executive and Case Committee now form a conjoint body. The unemployment problem is acute among the Union's clerical applicants, as well as in other occupations. Notice of vacancies will be gratefully received and every endeavour made to provide suitable employees. Booking to applicants is free, and only when an engagement results will the small fee of 2s. 6d. be charged. For employers a booking fee of 2s. 6d. has been instituted, and a further suiting fee of 7s. 6d. will be charged to non-members.

**Lease of Offices.** The lease of the present Offices expires in March, 1921, and fears were entertained whether the tenure of the rooms could be extended. A search for suitable premises at a moderate rental was unsuccessful, and finally a three years' extension of the lease of the present offices has been obtained. The increased rent and higher rates will double the expenses under the heading of rent, and to meet this the Committee have decided to sublet one room, the Union of Hebrew and Religion Classes becoming the tenants.

**Staff.** The Committee feel that much of the success attending their efforts during the past year has been due to the invaluable and constant assistance given by Miss Halford and her staff. Miss Halford's gift of sympathy, together with her resourcefulness and promptness in grappling with

difficulties, are warmly appreciated both by the Committee and all who come to the Office for advice or help. And the Office has had no easy year. Notwithstanding the growth of the Union and the corresponding increase in Office work, the Staff has been reduced, with a view to economy. Such devotion from everyone concerned, but more especially from Miss Halford and Miss Levy, calls for and receives the warmest thanks of the Committee and Members.

**Volunteers.** The valuable assistance rendered by volunteers in the clerical work of the Union is gratefully acknowledged, thanks being specially due to Miss Eva Finzi, Miss Miriam Rose and Miss Doris Davis, who have been giving regular assistance in the Office during the autumn and winter. Thanks for past help are also tendered to Miss Ruth Barnett, Miss Green and Miss Schwarzschild.

**Finance.** The Treasurer and Committee most gratefully acknowledge the receipt of a legacy of £12 from the Executors of the late Mrs. Henry Franklin. In response to their urgent appeal, not only were 135 new members enrolled, but many others largely increased their subscriptions. Nevertheless the Treasurer faces the new year with anxiety, for Office expenses generally have risen alarmingly in the last six months—rent, stationery and postage, to mention but a few of the more important items. This year it will be seen that the account closes solvent, but the very small balance of 15s. 11d. is only due to the fact that at the end of last year one of the small investments was realised to cover the deficit, and thus it was possible to start the year with a small balance. It is only in the current year that the full weight of increased expenditure will be felt, and therefore it is most earnestly hoped that with the ever growing recognition of the Union by those both inside and outside the community, a measure of support commensurate with the good work accomplished, and contemplated, may be accorded to it.
