to give him some much needed instruction.

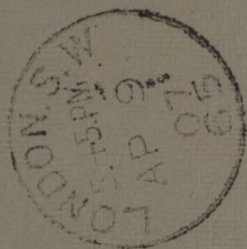
Can you kindly tell me what were
