Dear Mrs Park,

Thank you very much for your letter of September 19th with enclosures received to-day. I shall get the book, The Trade Union Woman which you recommend.

I am very glad you are receiving Jus Suffragii regularly.

We are always glad to get news from California. I see in the American Woman Suffrage Association weekly Bulletin that an interesting article has appeared in The Survey for September 16th dealing with the activities of civic organizations in California, and I think of quoting it in the November issue.

We ought to always have news from California in Jus Suffragii. Formerly we received the Women's Bulletin, but it has not come recently.

I am making enquiry of all the Suffrage States of America as to the statistics of their women electors, as we have been asked to put this information at the disposal of the Parliamentary Conference on the Franchise now sitting in this country.

With regard to your kind suggestion to send us some back numbers of Jus Suffragii, we have very good files from 1913, with the following exceptions:-

September and December 1913; October 1914;  
January and April 1915.

We should be very grateful for any numbers previous to May 1913 when the paper was issued in Holland but no regular files kept.
