Many thanks for your letter of the 13th inst., with enclosures.

I notice your letter to the Judge is dated the same day, so I presume it is written. Paragraph A is not quite correct as Mr. Justice Avory did expressly refer to a remark such as that made by Hawkins, which was no worse than yours; it did not amount to an interruption.
