



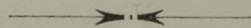

Transactions of the International Congress of Women, 1899.



Dear Madam,

The International Council of Women having done me the honour to entrust to my care the editing of the Transactions of the International Congress of Women, I am now engaged in the work of preparing the material for the press.

In commencing this undertaking, I find myself confronted with a serious difficulty, for the papers contributed to the Congress would alone fill three times the amount of space provided for by the sum which was set apart by the Committee for printing the Transactions. Under these circumstances the only way whereby this record of the Congress can be made as complete as its members would desire, is by increasing the size of the work, in the assurance that the extra expense will be covered by the profits of

the good sale which it should enjoy amongst the members of those Councils or Societies who were either present or directly interested in the meetings.

It will therefore be of very material assistance to the editor if you will make the publication of these volumes known amongst your friends, and obtain orders for them in advance.

We have decided to offer the books at 2/6 a volume, or at 15/- for the set of seven volumes, bound in paper cover; and 3/6 a volume, or at 21/- for the set of seven volumes, bound in cloth, until December 1, after which time the work will be published for the public generally at 3/6 a volume net (bound in cloth).

You will notice that the abundance of material in the Professional Section forces us to publish two volumes relating to that section. Thus the price of the whole set is unavoidably raised.
