Dear Madam,

The above Book Shop has recently been opened for the sale and display of publications in connection with women's work. Many Societies such as The Women's Industrial Council, British Women's Emigration Association, Parents National Educational Union, Y. W. C. A. & C. have already joined us and we are now hoping also to include women's political societies. Our fee to the Central Society for Women's Suffrage would be £1.1.0 per annum payable in advance, and for this sum we should be willing to sell and display your publications and to give to enquirers any possible information in regard

to your Society. Literature for sale would of course be sent on sale or return and we should retain the 25% commission usual at booksellers. Thus, if you had a pamphlet to be sold for 2d, we should give you 1½d for it and retain ½d. You would therefore incur no financial risk beyond the £1.1.0 already referred to, and in addition to the money you would receive from sales, you would secure an excellent advertisement in a central part of London.

I shall be glad to give you any further particulars should you require them, and much hope for your co-operation.
