Re my letter to the Judge which you have not sent on,
I am not sure as to your statement that the sentence is 4 months
from May 19th.

My impression is that after Nellie's speech, (which I think
impressed the judge) and after each of the 3 prisoners had been
sentenced to 4 months (the Judge said there were no previous
convictions against Misses Crocker & Roberts !) Miss Roberts
asked the Judge if allowance could not be made for the remand
period ? (nearly one month) he begged pardon and said "3 months".
