Dear Madam

I am instructed to ask you to bring before your Society the following resolutions passed by my Committee at a meeting held on Thursday November 4th.

1. "That in the event of an unfavourable reply being received from a Parliamentary candidate, a copy of the reply be handed to the W.S.S. in his Constituency begging it to arrange at once for him to be personally interviewed - if possible by a deputation of electors - and urged to declare his support in his Election address, the result to be forwarded to this office."
2. "That with a view to drawing attention to the National aspect of the work all Societies affiliated to the National Union be requested to print at the head of all communications issued by them the title "National Union of Women's Suffrage Societies," the name of the affiliated Society being printed underneath.
