Dear Madam,

I enclose the list of nominations for the Committee of Eleven which is to be formed to discuss Miss Gardner's Scheme for the re-organisation of the National Union.

According to the Resolution passed by the Council Meeting at Cardiff, the present Executive Committee must be represented on that Committee and it should also be pointed out that it is very important that the Committee should be as representative as possible of all parts of the country.

In case of vacancies arising later the person receiving the next highest number of votes will be asked to join the Committee.
